“The Limitations of Liberty”

St Paul in his letter to the Galatians talks about how Christianity can bring us freedom. It was quite a message to people who were under the Roman yolk and especially for those who were slaves. Many people today shy away from following Christ. They feel it is taking away their freedom.

Actually Christianity gives us the freedom to love and to know that there is someone who loves us even when we are unlovable, namely God. To belong to Christ gives us a chance to live our lives to the fullest, to reach happiness for all eternity. However freedom is not only a great privilege offered to us by God but also a great responsibility. The gift God gives to us must be given to others. We have to share with others. We need to love others as we love ourselves.

There are certain limitations of liberty. First of all we have to recognize Christ as our Lord. He is not a tyrannical ruler. He only wants the best for us. He loves us more than anyone else. He wants us to experience life to its fullest.

Other things do not give us freedom. For example money can be a beautiful servant but love of money can control our life. It becomes a cruel tyrant. Howard Hughes who became one of the richest persons in the United States lived his last years a lonely man. He didn't have any friends. He lost his appetite. He let his appearance deteriorate. He looked like a poor man. He didn't cut his nails or comb his hair or get a haircut. He didn't leave his house. He finally dried up and died. Attila the Hun was a rich man but died at an early age from liver disease from drinking too much. A person who does not control his (her) sex life can find that it controls him (her), and can destroy that person.

Another limitation of liberty is the oneness of the human family. Christ said “you shall love your neighbor as yourself.” We love ourselves quite a bit. We can't go around hurting other people. One individual on a team can hurt the whole team by committing one foul after another or hogging the ball. An alcoholic can ruin the life of his family.

We are not created robots We have the privilege of being free but we do have certain responsibilities. We have to accept the love of God in our lives. We also have the responsibility of loving others as we love ourselves.

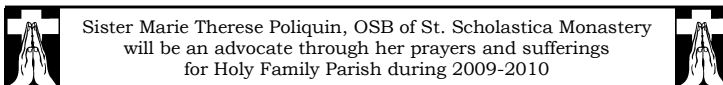
