

“On Learning How to Pray”

One thing the disciples asked Jesus to teach them was how to pray. This might seem to be a strange request since they were all brought up under the influence of a great religion. They were all Jews and probably experienced prayer at one time or another. Perhaps they were impressed on how often the Lord prayed, sometimes for hours.

What are some of the requirements to make prayer an important part of our life? First of all we have to learn that true prayer is rooted in a relationship. We spend a lot of time listening and talking to good friends. Jesus told them of a heavenly Father who loved them very much. If they loved His Father, they would want to spend time listening and talking to Him. Perhaps you didn't have a father who you cared to talk to. If this was the case, then think of one that you always wanted, one who is loving and wise and kind and strong and always is concerned for your highest good. Talk and listen to that father and you will discover God the Father.

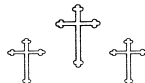
When you pray keep in mind another relationship, the other children of God who are your brothers and sisters, also loved by God the Father. True prayer can never be an exercise in selfishness, praying that you win the lottery. The whole family must be considered. Notice Jesus used the plural pronouns. He said: “Give us each day our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive all who do us wrong.”

A social dimension to prayer is inescapable. God has many children; He loves all of them. He is not interested in your prayers to win a fifty million dollar lottery. He's more interested in those who don't have enough to eat or a place to stay. We should pray for daily bread but it should also include the other hungry children. We belong to a large family. God is interested in all.

Next we should learn to pray patiently and persistently. Jesus told us to keep seeking, to keep knocking. You can't just pray once and expect it to happen immediately. Remember God lives in eternity; His time is different from ours. God never intended prayer to be a substitute for honest effort.

Finally we must pray submissively. Jesus prayed in the garden by saying, “Not My will but yours be done.” True prayer must always be offered in that same spirit.

Kayleen's Dad lost his job 18 months ago. He has been looking for a full time job but has found only temporary or part time jobs making it difficult to fully support his family. "If it were not for having backpacks available through CHUM," Kayleen's Dad explains, "Kayleen would start school with a couple of pencils and one notebook. I know how difficult it is as a child to fit in at school, and not having the proper supplies will make Kayleen stand out."

School counselors have told us time and again that children who come to school prepared on the FIRST DAY start their year out right.
