“Make Me A Child Again”

Many long to recapture the carefree innocence and joy of childhood. One person wrote the following: “Backward, turn backward, o time, in your flight; make me a child again, just for tonight.”

Christ urged people to hold on to some of the traits of childhood. He said “Anyone who refuses to come to God as a little child can never become part of His kingdom.” Of course some traits of childhood have to be gotten rid of, such as impatience and self-centeredness. Paul wrote, “When I became a man, I put away childish things.”

There are some basic elements of childhood we should strive to retain. One is openness. Kids have a thousand questions to ask and they listen attentively to the answers. The closed heart and mind are inventions of the adult world. To be a follower of Christ, we have to be open to something new to be learned every day. We have an expression that “you can’t teach old dogs new tricks.” This is not really true. It’s used by lazy adults who refuse to change their views. Our prayer should be “Open my heart and mind, make me a child again.”

A second characteristic of childhood worth keeping alive is trust. A child needs help and they place their trust in adults to fulfill their needs. When there is child abuse, it’s a great tragedy. We need to continue childlike faith in God and in other people. A cynical old man or woman is the work of the devil. A smiling old man or woman is one blessed by God. They have retained their childlike faith. When it comes to faith, we should ask through prayer: “Make me a child again.”

Another trait of childhood is love. A normal child seems always ready to love & to be loved. Kids at play quickly reconcile their differences and return to their game again. Adults tend to clutter up their lives with resentments and grudges and hatreds. We need to love openly & freely. Pray: “Make me a child again.”

We don’t need to drift away from God. We can grow toward Him. We just need openness, trust, honesty and love. Our daily prayer should be, “Lord, make me a child again.”
