“What Do We Really Want From Life”

A man came running up to Jesus asking, “What must I do to share in everlasting life?” He even knelt before Jesus. He saw something in Jesus he wanted but when Jesus told him what he had to do, he wasn’t ready to abandon his old life. Sometimes we have a lofty goal in our lives but we aren’t willing to pay the price. To become a lawyer or doctor or Priest means a number of years preparing for it. Not everyone is willing to do that. The man in the gospel was rich. When Jesus said, “Sell what you have and give to the poor...and after that, come and follow me,” this was too much for him. He really wanted temporary riches and not the riches of God’s kingdom.

We all want a worthwhile goal but we don’t always want to pay the price for it. All of us want loyal friends and a happy home but not all dedicate themselves to the sacrifice which is necessary to attain them. Everyone has a certain amount of selfishness and when we get to the point that only I matter, then the other things don’t come about.

If we want the finer things of life, we must pay for them. This means we have to work hard and not first think of ourselves. The rich man in the gospel had two choices- everlasting life and temporary riches. He chose the latter.

A young man or woman who wants a good marriage and a good home with children who love them, can only attain this by spending quality time with the family. Kids need to know you are interested in them more than they need your money.

If you really want Jesus in your life and you really seek everlasting life for yourself and your family than you have to discipline yourself and spend time with the Lord every day. You can’t put God in second place, calling on Him once or twice a year. If you make Jesus your best friend, the best things in life can be yours forever and ever.
