“A Kingdom of Right Relationships”

Camelot was a very popular movie several years ago. It was about a legendary kingdom, ruled by King Arthur, who was a fair and gentle man. He was assisted by a group of honest and courageous knights. Peace and harmony prevailed throughout the land. Camelot was the most wonderful place on earth for people to live. The temperature was just right. There was a legal limit to the snowfall. The rain was forbidden to fall 'till after sundown. By 8:00 the morning fog had to disappear.

Although Duluth is a nice place to live, the climate is not like Camelot. We have to brave the elements. Sometimes it's too cold; there are even times when it's too hot. We sometimes get too much snow and it rains during the day. Our kingdom is God's kingdom. We are not blessed each day with the best climate but we are blessed with good people.

God's kingdom is more concerned with human relationships. It's based on the commandments to love God with all our heart, soul, mind and strength and our neighbor as ourselves. To become saints, we have to first of all put God as the number one priority of our lives. God is not out there somewhere but He is right here with us. God loves us with all His heart, soul, mind and strength. To become a saint, we have to love God with all our being. We have to communicate with Him every day. We can't just call on Him when we have problems.

A second way to become a saint is to accept ourselves as the person we are. We have to accept ourselves the way we are before we can have a good relationship with others. First we have to recognize that we are a child of God with a mission to spread His love. Secondly, we should try our best not to do things that we would be ashamed of, if God should pay us a visit. If we do fail, we should seek forgiveness and also learn to forgive ourselves.

The third factor in becoming a saint is working to have a good relationship with the other children of God. We don't necessarily have to like everyone but we do have to love them. We don't have to be satisfied with their bad conduct. Sometimes we have to correct them but we still have to love them. We should try to help, not to hurt them. Remember God loves us even when we seem unlovable.
