“The Passing & The Permanent”

One thing that all of us have to cope with is change. Every person moves through various stages of development, childhood, adolescence, young adulthood, mature adulthood and old age. Each level of development confronts us with change. We must rethink our attitudes and readjust our method of living.

Not all change happens within ourselves. It also takes place in the world around us. I tried to buy a VCR at Sam’s but they didn’t have any. Years ago there would have been plenty to choose from. Years ago we didn’t have drug problems; today its all around us reaching out to youngsters in school The past years we’ve had to worry about Afghanistan and Iraq. One thing that doesn’t change is the words of Jesus. We are in a changing world but we still have to listen to what Jesus told us about the kingdom of God and our mission in it.

When I was a child we had a kaleidoscope. You could look in one end and see geometric patterns. If you turned it slightly it world dramatically change. Our modern world is like that. When we feel comfortable, some unseen hand turns the kaleidoscope and the patterns change. We are forced to rethink our values and rearrange our lives whether we want to or not.

It isn’t pleasant to change our lifestyle. I had only 12 days notice to change from working in Florida with Latinos and Haitians and Caribbean’s to Duluth to work with Polish, Irish, French and other nationalities. This was tough. I was just getting to the point where things were coming together. The English speaking were starting to praise the Latinos instead of criticizing them. A German-Irish Priest was moved to a parish where they had been used to Polish Priests. Fortunately it all worked out. I found loving people here and now don’t even think of returning to Florida. I found my home here.

We have to take a positive attitude toward change. Jesus was a man who believed in change. He challenged society of His day to change. This led to His death on a cross. The apostles gave up their lives to see this change take place We can not be passive to injustices and poverty and prejudice and discrimination and to lack of commitment to the kingdom of God.

Finally we cannot deal with change by ourselves but only by accepting the unchanging words of the Lord and His example. We have to live by the Golden rule, reaching out to others. Our world is changing faster today than before but there is a permanence. Christ assures us, “The heavens and earth will pass away, but my words will not.”
