“Who Was Jesus?”

An elderly man decided to donate his body to the state medical university. Father Larry Antus did the same. The man’s children argued against it. The man simply replied that when I move out of this body, I think it might make for some interesting study.

In every generation, people have tried to figure out who Jesus was. Was He truly the word of God that became a human being like you and I? Did He really suffer pain as you and I do? When was He truly human? When did God take over in His life? This is a mystery that is hard to solve. The Pharisees were constantly trying to figure out who Jesus was. The apostles also were trying to figure Him out.

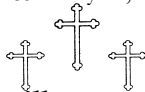
The Trinity of God is even more perplexing. Jesus talked about His heavenly Father. He also talked about the Spirit of truth that would guide us to the truth. He spoke of the Holy Spirit who would “glorify Jesus and that He would take what is mine and declare it to you.” He told the apostles to baptize in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. He was constantly praying to His heavenly Father.

He was talking many times of sending the Holy Spirit to guide the church. The Holy Spirit did come on Pentecost Sunday to the apostles and changed their lives. They would open the doors and courageously face torture and death in preaching about the Trinitarian God. They would baptize in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Jesus was one with the Father and the Holy Spirit. It was not only the Father who created the world but all three, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. All three are part of our faith, three persons in one God. Confusing isn’t it?

I wrote a long paper on the trinity before I was ordained a Priest. I received an A on the paper. Quite honestly the more I worked on it, the more questions popped up in my mind. I wished I had chosen a different subject to write on. Let’s face facts. The church has declared that Jesus was both God and man. It also has taught us that we have a Trinitarian God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We believe it partly because of what the church says but more importantly because Jesus proclaimed it. Is it understandable? Not really. It’s a mystery which we can’t solve. We can only accept it because of our faith in Jesus and in God.

June is here and in only two weeks we will be celebrating all things rhubarb at the 7th Annual CHUM Rhubarb Festival. We look forward to seeing you and your family!

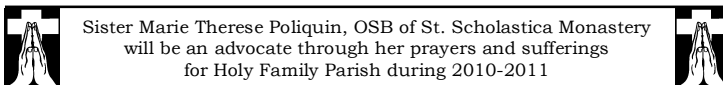
